BIG FALLS EDDY

New and Improved River Access in Troy

The Village of North Troy Trustees met with members of the Vermont River Conservancy regarding a plan they had for land donated to them. Below is their story:

Big Falls of the Missisquoi is the highest undammed waterfall in Vermont, and is on a stunning stretch of the federally designated Wild & Scenic Missisquoi River. The lands immediately surrounding the upper reaches of the roaring falls have been part of Big Falls State Park since the mid-1990's, and while the state park is a great spot to view the falls, snap photos, or have a picnic, the falls' steep cliffs would be incredibly dangerous for would-be swimmers or anglers.

That's why with the generous donation of the land from Anne and Bruce McKay we were able to protect the large pools just downstream. The McKays donated this 2.8-acre parcel to Vermont River Conservancy, protecting access to swim and fish below Big Falls. We protected the land several years ago and local residents have been visiting these pools to picnic, fish, and splash, but without a clear parking area, sign, or maintained trail, it wasn't obvious that visitors are welcome to enjoy the protected riverfront. Last year we worked with local community members to choose a name for the site – Big Falls Eddy – to showcase the large quiet pool below the falls. Then we got to work on improvements that will wrap up this fall: a new parking area, road sign, an informative kiosk, benches, a wide flat path to the rivers' edge, and large stone steps that bring you to the river.

We are grateful to work with the Town of Troy and the Village of North Troy to create this special place. With these new improvements we are excited to see local residents who have loved this place for generations get to experience the falls safely, and we are excited to welcome new visitors who can now enjoy the large pool at the base of Big Falls.

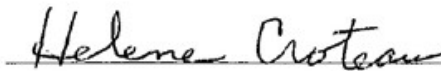

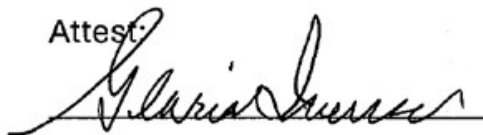

2025 Trustees' Report

We have begun the renovations of the Poulin Building. A new standing seam roof was installed, and the solar panels have been ordered. Construction will be completed by December 2026 with funds from the Municipal Energy Resilience Plan (MERP) Grant.

Derek Medley resigned as public works assistant and John Farley was hired to fill his position. John was also hired to maintain the sidewalks this winter. He has done an outstanding job.

A Better Back Road Highway Grant for Dominion Avenue ditching was completed this past summer. A Vermont Grants-in-Aid Grant was used to complete roadside ditching on North Jay Road.

The Village Trustees have been meeting with Amanda Garland from the Vermont River Conservancy regarding the newly named “Big Falls Eddy Park” located on River Road. The picture on the front of this book and the inside cover story will explain in more detail.

The North Troy Fire Department, under the leadership of Albert and John Farley, have done a great job rebuilding their department. They have attracted new younger volunteers and have been involved in various local firefighter trainings. This year their rescue vehicle did not pass inspection. They were able to find a used rescue, in very good condition, from the Derby Line Fire Department. They were able to sell the old rescue for parts. We appreciate their efforts.

The Village Trustees and the Town Select Board have been meeting regularly since this past summer regarding a possible Troy/North Troy merger. There will be a presentation at both the annual Town Meeting on March 3rd and the annual Village Meeting on March 17th to explain the details and benefits of a merger. We hope to see everyone there so that we may answer any questions you have. The vote will be held during the Vermont State Primary on August 11, 2026, at the Town Clerk's Office. We urge all registered voters to come out and vote.

Our regularly scheduled Trustee meetings are held on the second Tuesday of each month.

All are welcome to attend.
