Recent Achievements by Revitalizing Troy Committees:

We have been very busy the past few months!

We hosted three Movie and Game Nights for the youth! They have been a fun success. Our final one before summer break was mid-May. The event is supported by local community organizations and volunteer adults but hosted by the RTC youth Committee. The kids have demonstrated enormous respect and responsibility in the space and we are so excited to see them have a safe third space to use and interact in their community on Friday nights. Thank you to Ms. Kricket for the donation of the popcorn. The pizza was donated each night by local community members and other fundraising efforts. The students would love to continue these Friday fun nights. In order to make this a reality we still need donations, volunteers and Pizza sponsors. We also hosted 3 FREE community dinners, games, and music nights this year at the Legion, and served over 170 people our final night! Since the inception of these community dinners in 2024 we have served OVER 1000 FREE meals!!
